CHRIST (Deemed to be University), began as Christ College in 1969 offering undergraduate programmes in Sciences, Humanities, Social Sciences and Commerce. From 1992 it began offering Masters programmes in Social Sciences and Sciences, and Management. It was the first Institution in Karnataka and one of first 14 in India to be accredited by NAAC in 1997. It became the first college in Karnataka to be granted Autonomous status by UGC in 2004. It was the first Institution in South India to be reaccredited with NAAC A+ Grade in 2005. In 2006 it was accorded the College with Potential for Excellence status by UGC. Based on the quality of academics at the Institution, past performance, and future potential, the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India conferred the status of Deemed to be University on the Institution vide

Notification No. F. 9-34/2007-U.3(A) dated 22 July 2008.

Primarily a liberal arts Institution, CHRIST (Deemed to be University) offers 51 Bachelor, 50 Master, 19 MPhil and 23 Doctoral programmes in Humanities, Social Sciences, Sciences, Commerce, Management, Law, Engineering, Architecture and Education to about 22500 students from all the states and union territories of India and 58 other countries.

Apart from being ranked well since 2007 in almost all higher education ranking surveys, the University has also been ranked in QS Asia, QS India and QS BRICS Ranking. CHRIST (Deemed to be University) is also ranked 301+ in the Times Higher Education University Impact Ranking 2019. In the raking it is grouped in 101–200th for Quality Education and 201–300th for Gender Equity, globally.

With 'Excellence and Service' as the Vision, the University is actively involved in community development through student involvement. The University has slum and rural development projects with a focus on women and children in the city of Bengaluru, in the states of Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh directly benefiting over 10000 families. The students and staff of the University sponsor the primary education of over 900 students in the slums of Bengaluru annually through voluntary contribution

National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) is an organisation that assesses and accredits higher education Institutions (HEIs) in India. It is an autonomous body funded by University Grants Commission of Government of India headquartered in Bengaluru. NAAC was established in 1994 as per the recommendations of National Policy in Education (1986). This policy was to "Address the issues of deterioration in quality of education", and the Programme of Action (POA-1992) laid out strategic plans for the policies including the establishment of an independent national accreditation body. Consequently, the NAAC was established in 1994 with its headquarters at Bengaluru.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell in CHRIST (Deemed to be University) was established on 03 November 2003. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of CHRIST. For this, during the post-accreditation period, it channelizes all efforts and measures of the Institution towards promoting its holistic academic excellence.

Centre for Education Beyond Curriculum (CEDBEC)

The Centre was established in 1998 to stimulate and rediscover through experience, the perspectives in education so that individuals and institutions reflect and rediscover themselves and move towards sustainable progress in the educational arena.

Objectives

In the move towards enhancing quality in higher education in general and universities in specific, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has introduced a new process of assessment and accreditation since July 2017. Considering the character of its process that encompasses both qualitative and quantitative dimensions and representing an explicit Paradigm Shift making it ICT enabled, objective, transparent, scalable and robust. Through the seminar, the competencies of participating key personnel from universities with regard to quality awareness will be identified and efforts will be made to disseminate and transfer quality ideas to all concerned in their respective institutions. As a key outcome institutions will gain increased awareness on the overall approach to the new NAAC quality Framework.

Further, IQAC faculty members and administrators in their respective institutions will acquire capabilities and conceptual clarity of the revised NAAC Assessment and Accreditation (A&A) Framework.

The key university personnel develop institutional capacity building in understanding Quality Indicator Framework (QIF). Institutional personnel will develop a deeper understanding of the process of developing their capacity and competencies for preparation of SSR, data mining and articulating as per NAAC Framework.

Institutions will develop the efficiency and developmental procedures in the effective management of IQAC in their institutions.

Institutions develop several support systems and mentoring departments in the quality assurance process.

Enable participating institutions to evolve best practices on their own and for enhancing changes of their Institutions and quality in higher education in general.
