Introduction

Major suggestions given by all the stakeholders for the academic year 2017-2018

All the stakeholders have suggested that diversification and skill enhancement is a very important part of teaching-learning and the thrust should also be for lab-based learning wherever possible.

The major suggestions proposed are the inclusion of core courses like skill enhancement courses, generic elective courses along with three discipline-specific elective courses/specializations - Human Resource and Marketing Management, Banking and Insurance, and Finance and Accounting.

Two new Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) - Basics of Microsoft Excel (Lab-based) and Business Analytics suggested to be introduced with credits. It is also proposed to include the Data analytics tool 'IDEA' as a part of their hands-on training sessions for the course Business Analytics subject.

The Article / Report will be evaluated for 100 marks based on submission and Viva Voce on individual basis conducted by a panel of judges. The course carries 4 credits.

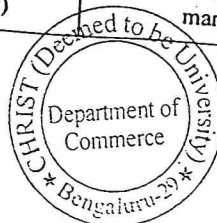

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Studies of the Department of Commerce held on 01 February 2018 at 2:30 PM at the Conference Room (119), Block IV, CHRIST (Deemed to be University).

In the Chair: Dr. Theresa Nithila Vincent, Head, Department of Commerce

The meeting commenced on time with a silent prayer. Dr. Nithila Vincent welcomed the new external expert Dr Alyosius Edward, Dean, Commerce and Management, Kristu Jayanti College, other external experts, and faculty members. The matters on the agenda listed in the notice were taken up in the same serial order.

Members Present

All members were present. Leave of Absence was granted to the following members:

1. Dr Amalanathan. S - Faculty Member, Department of Commerce
2. Mr Anson K J – Faculty Member, Department of Commerce
3. Dr Lijeesh P - Faculty Member, Department of Commerce

Ms. Swetha V, Consultant, was a invitee who represented Miles Education for discussions specific to the new BCom (Strategic Finance Honours) CMA integrated programme.

Declaration of Quorum and Calling the Meeting to Order

The Chairperson declared the validity of the quorum and called the Meeting to Order.

MATTERS ON THE AGENDA

1: To confirm the Minutes of the previous meeting held on 20 January 2017.

The minutes of the previous Board of Studies meeting held on 20 January 2017 and the Special Board of Studies held on 07th December 2017 were duly reviewed and confirmed by the members item wise. The Chairperson confirmed that the recommendations of the Board made in the previous year had been duly implemented.

2: To consider and approve the new Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) curriculum and syllabus for 5th and 6th semester BCom and BCom (Honours) programmes, applicable for the 2016 batch.

BCom Programme

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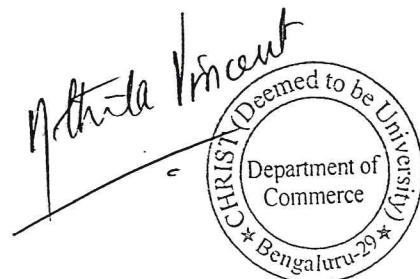


- The new CBCS curriculum applicable for 5th and 6th semester for the 2016 -19 BCom batch was presented before the Board and was approved. New courses for the 5th and 6th semester broadly classified under- core courses, skill enhancement courses, generic elective course along with three discipline specific elective courses/specializations - Human Resource and Marketing Management, Banking and Insurance, and Finance and Accounting were considered and approved.
- Two new Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) - Basics of Microsoft Excel (Lab based) and Business Analytics is introduced with 2 credits each.
- Students opting for Finance and Accounting elective shall have COM 643C - Risk in Financial services as a course in the sixth semester. Completing this course as part of the BCOM programme will grant them fee exemption from the CISI third module 'Risk in Financial Services as per the MOU with CISI UK. However, they should have cleared the first two modules to receive the CISI -IOC certification.

The Board made the following observations:

- Clarity was sought on the introduction of Basics of Microsoft Excel in the 5th semester as against introducing the same in the 3rd or the 4th semester. It was informed that the same was being considered for the batches following the current batch. It was also suggested that the syllabus for Basics of Microsoft Excel module could be made at an advanced learner level. The Chair clarified that the standard syllabus used for MS Excel Specialist certification is adopted as the syllabus for this course.
- The Board appreciated and opined that the course curriculum for Risk and Financial Services and Business Analytics had been well structured and had included the necessary modules as per the industry requirements.
- It was suggested that 'Digital marketing' could be incorporated in any course under the HR & Marketing specialization. The Board considered the suggestions and agreed to incorporate it appropriately.
- It was opined by the experts that the 5th Semester Management Accounting syllabus was elaborate in nature and could be considered for revision. The Board welcomed the suggestion with the decision to incorporate it in the final syllabus.
- It was recommended that data analytics tool 'IDEA' to be a part of their hands on training sessions for the course "Business Analytics". The Board accepted the recommendation.

BCom (Honours) Programme



- The new CBCS curriculum applicable for 5th and 6th semester for the 2016 -19 BCom (Honours) Batch was presented before the Board and was duly approved. New courses for the 5th and 6th semester broadly classified under Core Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses and with two Discipline Specific Elective/Specializations – Finance and Investment, and Banking and Insurance were thoroughly discussed and approved.

The Board made following observations:

- The Board accepted the suggestion to include the legal regulatory framework under the Unit 7 - Corporate Governance in the Auditing and Corporate Governance course syllabus (COH532).
- The Board suggested that COH541A Risk in Financial Services course, Unit 5-Model Risk, Risk Oversight and Corporate Governance, maybe renamed to Model Risk, Risk Oversight and ERM. It was decided to accept the suggestion.
- The Board opined that the COH543A Strategic Financial Management, Unit 5-Corporate Valuation & Shareholder value creation is too elaborate and suggested reducing the content. The Chair proposed review of the same.


3: To consider and recommend the changes in curriculum for 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Semester BCom and BCom (Honours) programmes.

- The restructure, replacement and update in the course syllabus for 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th semester BCom and BCom (Honours) programmes were presented semesterwise. The various changes incorporated were discussed in brief and approved.

4: To consider and approve the curriculum and syllabus of the new BCom (Strategic Finance Honours) Programme commencing from June 2018.

- A new programme was proposed to be introduced from June 2018 integrated with the globally recognised Certified Management Accountant (CMA) certification awarded by the Institute of Management Accountants (IMA), USA. The programme structure is an integration of the existing BCom (Honours) syllabus and CMA programme. IMA official study materials from WILEY would be provided to the students and used for instruction. IMA's authorised training partners in India – Miles Education would teach these courses during regular working hours scheduled in the timetable. The assessment and end semester examination pattern for these five courses shall be Lab based online examinations aligned with IMA assessment pattern.
- The assessment pattern mentioned below was discussed in detail.
 - Each course carries maximum of 100 marks and is evaluated as follows:

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- For all courses Internal Assessment and End Semester ratio- 60:40
- For all courses minimum pass percentage 50 %. (Aggregate of Internal + End Semester marks)
- For CMA integrated courses.

CIA- Case analysis, Quiz, MCQs

ESE – Lab based online examinations

- The courses borrowed from BCom (Honours) will continue with the same course code 'COH' while the CMA syllabus courses will have a course code 'COSF'.
- The summer internship time period for the BCOM (Strategic Finance Honours) programme would be of 3 months duration. Students shall undertake a 3-month internship preferably from 15 April to 15 July in the fifth semester. Allocation of 4 credits and 100 marks for the Internship Report and Viva shall be incorporated in the fifth semester marks card. To accommodate the extended internship period, there would be a reduction of one core course and increase in the number of hours (6 hours) per week for the remaining courses in the fifth semester, to adjust the course load.
- The programme structure and the syllabus content for the first two semesters were discussed in detail and approved by the Board.
- The Board applauded and appreciated the right direction in which the department is progressing by continuously incorporating necessary changes as and where necessary, based on the relevant industry requirements.
- The Board suggested that the programme be marketed with the help of industry connect.

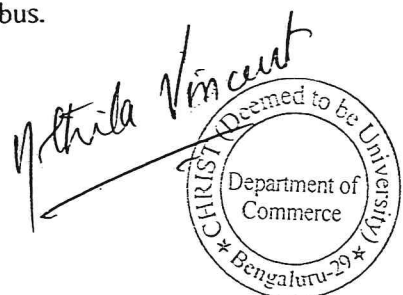
5: To consider and recommend the changes in the curriculum for MCom and MPhil (Commerce) programmes

MCom Programme:

- The following changes were considered and approved by the Board:
- To remove the course MCO343A International Accounting.
- To split the course MCO341A Advanced Cost and Management Accounting into two separate courses as follows:
 - MCO 341A - Advanced Cost Accounting
 - MCO 343A - Management Accounting and Financial Analysis
- To modify the course syllabus MCO 342A - Advanced Financial Accounting.

MPhil Commerce Programme:

There were no changes proposed in the MPhil Programme syllabus.



6: To review the Results of the October 2017 End Semester Examination for all programmes.
The Result Analysis of the End Semester Examinations October 2017 for BCom, BCom (Honours) and MCom programmes were reviewed by the Board. The Board applauded the department for its good results.


7: To consider and approve the panel of external examiners for MCom and MPhil programmes.
The list of external examiners for MCom and MPhil programmes was presented to the Board and was reviewed and confirmed.

8: To review the research and publications progress of faculty and students.

- It was informed that the faculty publications in ICI/Scopus/ UGC indexed journals for the period 2017-18 was 27.
- Number of faculty members with PhD was 19, which includes 4 faculty members who were awarded with PhD in the period 2017-18. Number of faculty who had submitted PhD synopsis: 05.
- Number of individual student publications (UG/PG) – 4
- Details of Student-Faculty Joint Publications were as below:
 - Number of papers published 29
 - Number of papers accepted 13
 - Number of papers under review 24
- Total 66

9: To consider any other matter with the permission of the Chair.

- COH 412 – Entrepreneurship, SEC with 2 credits for the BCom (Honours) programme has been changed as a full CIA based paper effective 2017 batch. [15 marks CIA I, 15 marks CIA 2, 15 marks CIA III with B-Plan Submission, 5 marks for attendance]. The same is applicable for BCom programme in the 6th semester - COM611 Entrepreneurship is fully made as a CIA based paper.
- Generic electives syllabus has been revised and have been discussed as per item 2 of the agenda.
- Risk in Financial Services, CISI 3rd module has been integrated into the finance elective stream for BCom and BCom Hons. Fee exemption granted from CISI, subject to completion of Introduction and GSO modules.
- The Insurance Institute of India (III) courses, Principles of Insurance (COH541B), Practices of Life Insurance & General Insurance (COH542B) and Regulations of Insurance Business (COH543B) have been moved to the 5th semester BCom Honours programme to enable students obtain the Licentiate certificate before graduation.
