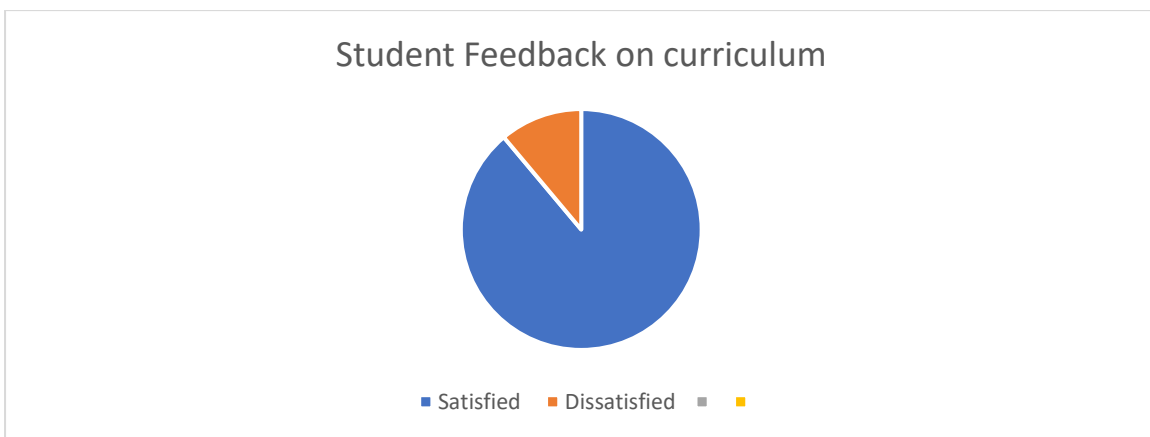
1. Introduction

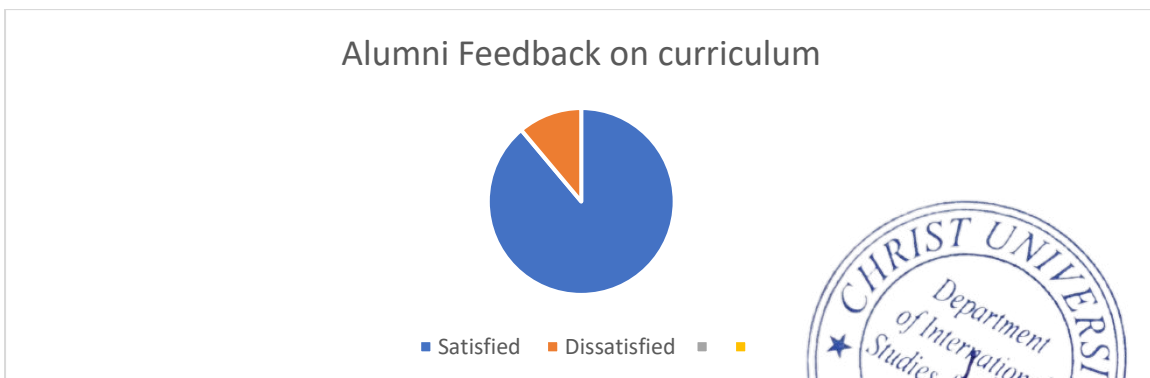

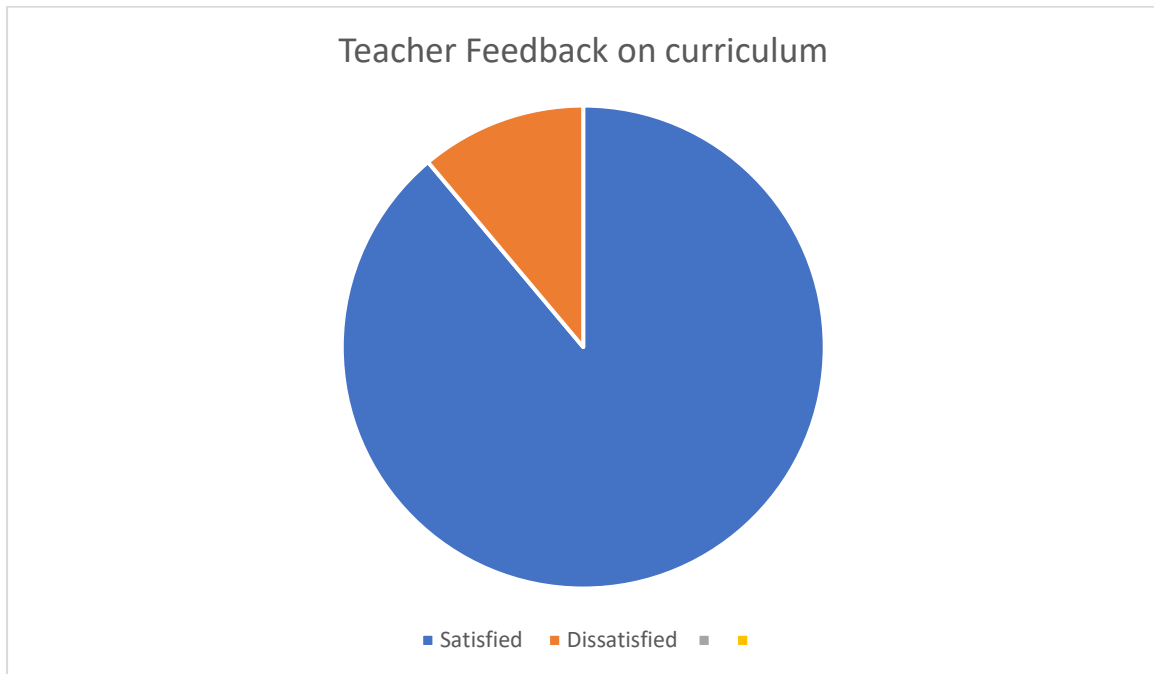
Feedback from Alumni

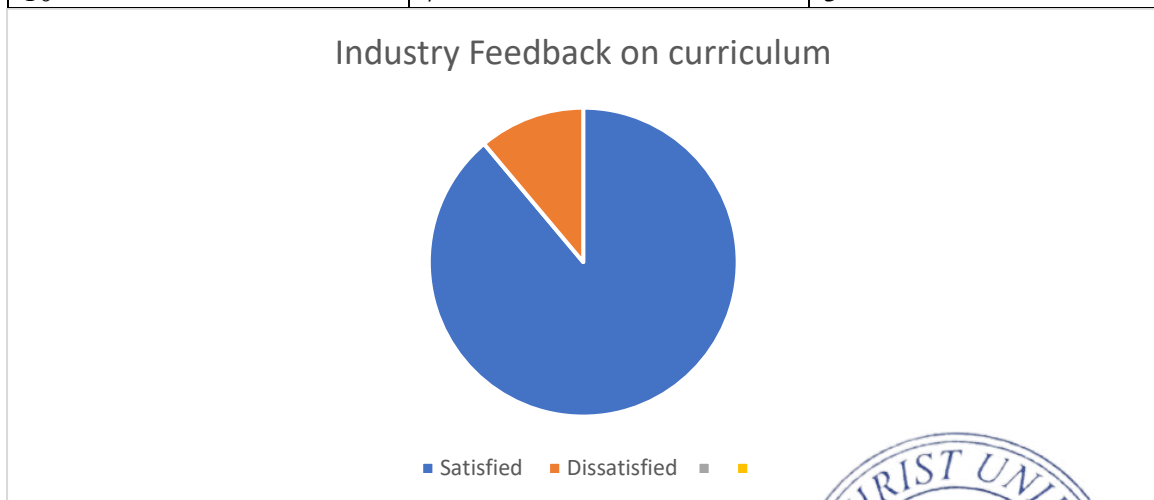
Feedback from Teachers

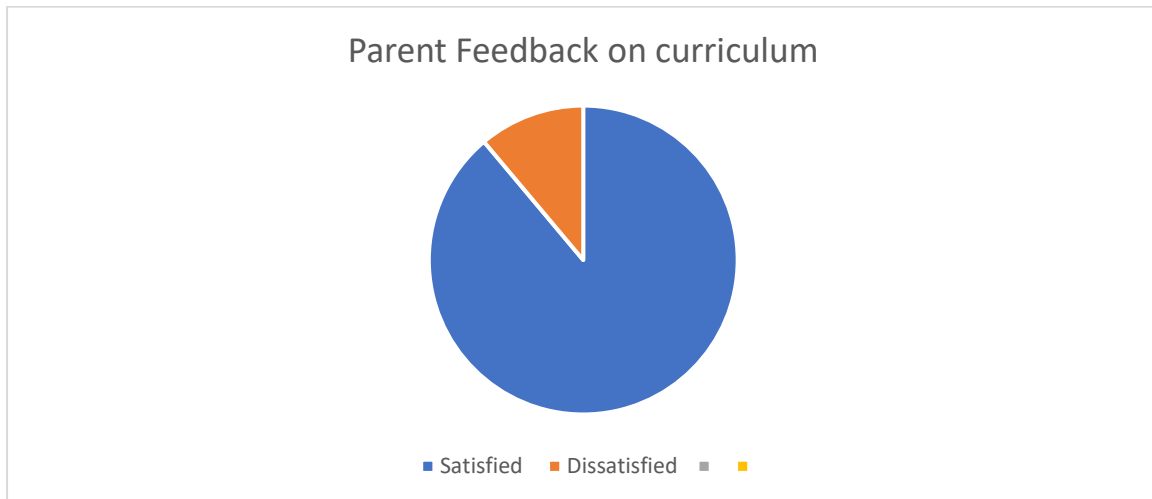

3. Action Taken











