The analysis of feedback obtained, and suggestions given by the stakeholders are indicated below.


## Summary of descriptive feedback received on curriculum for the year 2018 – 2019


The feedback states as satisfied for the criteria of curriculum enhances the knowledge and skills in the relevant domain. It suggests improvement in the criteria of enhancing the knowledge and skills in the relevant domain. The feedback received from the students state that the curriculum satisfy the stated objectives and learning outcomes. An equal amount of students states that the curriculum covers the advanced topics and text books and reference materials are relevant to the content of the curriculum. Their feedback was mainly on improvement and enhancement of the syllabus content. The criteria of curriculum orient towards higher education to be considered more to be improved. It also suggests employability to be given more weightage in the design and development of curriculum.

Few of the parents feedback suggests a considerable amount of improvement in orient the students towards higher education, employability given weightage in the design and development of the curriculum, including a component on value based education. The feedback is satisfactory in the categories curriculum promote self-study and attitude of research, curriculum orient the students towards higher education and curriculum have components to serve the needs of the society.

The teachers feedback mentions that the curriculum is satisfactory in terms of stated objectives and learning outcomes, developing independent thinking and review of the curriculum. The industry feedback mentions an equal amount of Excellent and Good parameters for the mentioned criteria.


