


Feedback Analysis Report 2020-21

The students made the following comments to improve the course structure, instruction, and assessment.


- More time to do assignments, asynchronous assignments could be less tedious;

- Five courses in the last semester, dissertation, admission applications, and now asynchronous activities, are indeed hectic.






Is the syllabus updated on a regular basis depending on the current trends and advanced topics?


Does the syllabus orient the students towards higher education?


Does the syllabus provide employability weightage?


Does the syllabus meet the expectations of the industry?






Does the syllabus encourage entrepreneurship?
