ABSTRACT

This research aims to critically analyse the provisions of corporate insolvency resolution process, to examine whether IBC is facilitating rehabilitation of insolvent corporations and protecting the interest of creditors, so as to balance their interests. Primary data for the study was collected through a structured interview of stakeholders and conclusion was drawn through a qualitative thematic analysis using NVivo software. The findings showed that the CIRP does not balance the interest of financial creditor, operational creditor and the corporate debtor.
