
# REPORT ON THE WEBINAR - "BUSINESS TRANSFORMATIONS"



The Department of Commerce under the banner of the IMA Christ (Deemed to be University) Student Chapter organized its very first project, a webinar on 'BUSINESS TRANSFORMATIONS' on 30th January 2021, Saturday. The webinar was organized by students of B.Com. Strategic Finance honors under the constant guidance of Prof Lakshmi B. It was attended by over 190 students of the Department of Commerce.

Shriyam Agrawal, a student of 4B.Com. Strategic Finance Honours Programme and the President of IMA Christ (Deemed to be University) Student Chapter emceed the event. He extended a warm welcome to the keynote speaker and all the dignitaries present. The keynote speaker was Mr. J. Stephen McNally from Ohio, USA. He is a CMA, CPA, and currently the CFO of Plastic Technologies (PTI) Inc. Sir was recently named the Chair-Elect of IMA's Global Board of Directors for the fiscal year 2020-2021. Sir, a member of IMA's Toledo Chapter, is currently


serving on the IMA Global Board of Directors and is the board liaison to the IMA Committee on Ethics. He also served on the IMA Leadership Academy faculty and the IMA Accounting Honor Society advisory board. He is a former chair of the IMA Member Relations, PerformanceOversight and Audit, and Annual Conference Program Committees. The dignitaries present wereDr. Tomy K Kallarakal, Dean - School of Commerce, Finance and Accountancy; Dr. Theresa Nithila Vincent, HOD - Department of Commerce; Prof. Lakshmi Academic coordinator, BCom Strategic Finance Honours Program; Mr. Fenil Vadaken, Manager - Relationship Development, IMA India; and Mr. Vardarajan Guruprasad, President, IMA Bangalore Chapter.

The event was initiated with the encouraging words of our Dean Dr. Tomy K Kallarakal who set the tone for the chapter activities. It was followed by the introduction of our keynote speaker Mr. J. Stephen McNally. He gave a highly informative and enlightening presentation on the topic 'Business transformations- No Pain, No Gain?' Wherein he talked about the reality of business transformations and told how transformations are all about trying to change the way you do business whether on a global enterprise-wide scale or one that is more limited. He talked about different typical transformations which included CEO, CFO, & and other personnel changes, endto-end process changes, in-house vs. outsourced services, and more. He also discussed several reasons to engage in a transformation. It was followed by a business case on transforming supply chain finance wherein he talked about the setup as well as the journey from the "Call" to the ongoing "future state" including three separate phases which were On-site training, Remote training, and Go Live. He then discussed the different lessons learned from the trenches like Risk and project management, Consultants, Communication, Sustainability, project plan, and more. He then talked about the five potential pitfalls to success which are the sustainability challenge, Inability to execute, Unexpected roadblocks, a Bigger challenge than anticipated, and neglecting the people. He finished it off with an encouraging call to action. After the insightful presentation, the window for the QnA session was opened. A lot of doubts regarding CMA and other related career prospects were asked by students which were precisely answered by Mr. J Stephen.

In the end, Apoorv Maheshwari, the student organizer from 4 BCom Strategic Finance Honours delivered the vote of thanks to the keynote speaker, all the dignitaries present, and all the fellow christites for attending the event. Overall, the event was a success and was a very enlightening session for all the students present.














### Rate your overall webinar experience, in terms of informativeness and learning:



He is also chair of IMA's Governance Standing Board Committee, the IMA Europe Board, and the ICMA Board of Trustees. In addition, he serves as a trustee of the IMA Memorial Education Fund and the IMA Research Foundation Board of Trustees. In his role as Global Board Chair, Steve oversees all Global Board committee work, presides over all Global Board meetings, and works closely with IMA's president/CEO to ensure that staff and the Global Board are engaged and achieving IMA's strategic plan.

Steve is CFO, treasurer, and secretary of Plastic Technologies Inc. (PTI) Group of Companies. Based in Holland, Ohio, the PTI Group serves nearly every major consumer goods company and is recognized worldwide for sustainable packaging innovation.

Prior to joining the PTI Group, Steve was the finance executive for Campbell Soup Company's Napoleon & Flavor Operations, including Campbell's premier Soup, Sauce, and Beverage operations in Northwest Ohio, Campbell's flavor operations in Milwaukee, and a network of approximately 50 warehouses, co-manufacturers, and re-packers throughout the U.S. Steve joined Campbell's in 1995, progressing through a variety of positions with increasing responsibility, including roles in internal audit, brand finance, sales finance, business development, corporate supply chain, and special project teams. Steve started his career with Price Waterhouse in Philadelphia.
