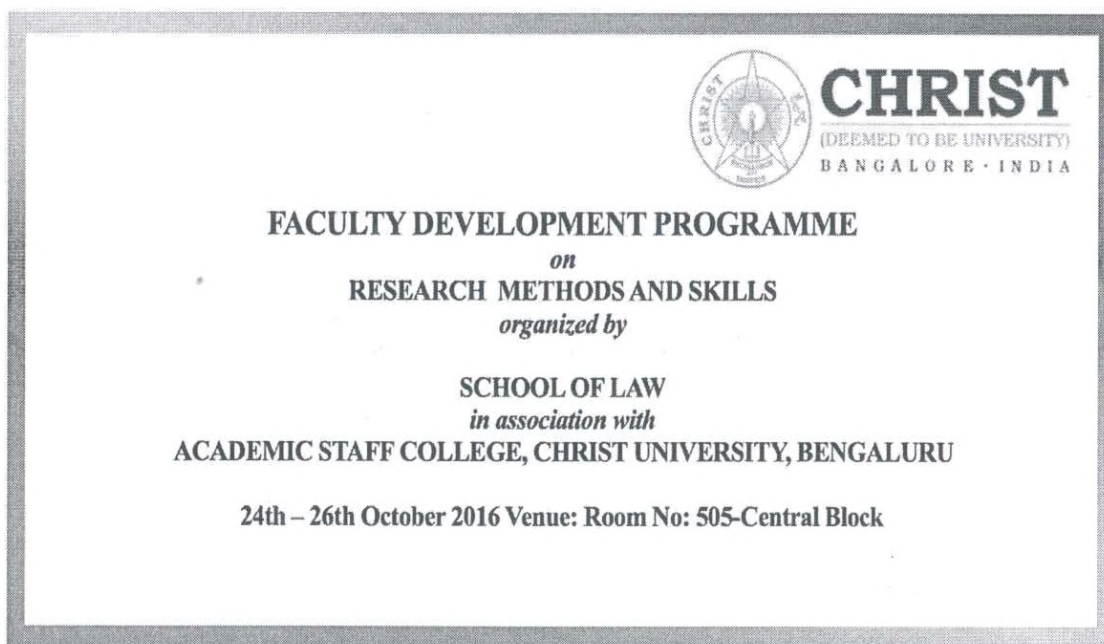

On 1st December 2016 for the first two sessions Prof S S Vishweshwaraiah, Administrative expert and Former VC of Karnataka University was the external observer. In these sessions four faculties made presentation on their PhD proposal. The first presenter was Mr. Avishek Chakraborty Asst. Prof SLCU, made presentation on *"Copy right infringement in Hindi and Bengali film music industry in India -A critical study of the role of Indian law enforcement mechanism."* Suggestions were given to find out statistical report to show whether copy right infringement is increasing or decreasing and to find out whether existing legal frame work in India is compatible or not to solve the issue.

The Second presenter was Ashok Rodrigues Asst. Prof SLCU, made presentation on his PhD proposal *"An empirical study of performance of courts of civil judges in Karnataka ,introduction of ICT"*. Suggestions were given to narrow down the topic and have more clarity in definition for identifying as to whether the topic would make any significant knowledge to the existing knowledge.

The Third presenter was Pukhraj Agarwal Asst. Prof SLCU, made his presentation on *"A critical study of Impact of Doctrine of non-refoulement upon extradition treaties between countries from 1973 to 2014."* Suggestion was given to identify whether there can be a reconciliation between the parties.

The fourth presenter in the morning session was Subha C C Asst. Prof SLCU, made presentation in her PhD proposal on *"Sale and transplantation of human organs in India, critical evaluation on legal frame work "* Suggestions were given to pay more attention to grammar and punctuation and for following uniform system of citation.

The afternoon session was on Discussion of Research proposal of minor research projects four faculties had made their presentation Prof G B Reddy, Osmania law university was the external observer .The first presenter was Sawmya Suresh, Asst. Prof SLCU, who made her on presentation on "*Prevention of corruption in India – a study under Indian legal frame work*". Suggestions were given to conduct a legal study, for reframing objective and methodology and to narrow down the topic to a specific period.



The Second presenter was Ujwala, Asst. Prof SLCU, made her presentation on "*Protection of software programs with patent and copy right*". Suggestions were given to explore the relevance of *suigeneris* protection in the area apart from patent and copy right protection and identify the difficulty of stake holders and for including practical issues with regard to copy right protection.

The Third presenter was Anubha Srivastava, Asst. prof SLCU, who made her presentation on "*Regulation of real estate sector in Bangalore – a study from consumer rights perspective.*" Suggestions were given to identify whether the present real estate bill has affected the objective of the study and to identify the assurance that can be given to consumers.

On 2nd December 2016 Prof. S S Vishweshwaraiah Asst. Prof SLCU, was the external observer for PhD presentation and One MRP Presentation made by faculty members. Alexander D Samuel made presentation on "*A Comparative study of International Law in Asian and medieval period between north and south India.*" Suggestions were given

to identify whether in thesis writing secondary sources are acceptable.

Second presentation was made by Dinkar Gitte Asst. Prof SLCU, on "*Use or threat of use of Nuclear weapon under International Laws – A critical study*". Suggestions were given to have in clarity in hypothesis research methodology and to do research in qualitative nature.

Third presenter was George K Jose, Associate Professor made presentation on "*Food security from an idea to a right*". Suggestions were given to include jurisprudential concepts for reframing the objective and research questions.

The fourth presenter was Dr G V Ranganath, Associate Professor made presentation on "*B T cotton a socio legal study in India*". Suggestions were given to identify the usefulness of the study and to highlight the original contribution.

Afternoon session was on '*Discussion and Review of Research and Publication Initiatives of the Department*' handled by Dr. Shampa I Dev & Dr. Mallaiah M.R with Dr. Sharmila as the internal observer.

Objectives:

- a. Analysing the existing Research and Publication initiatives of the Department
- b. Importance of Research and Publication initiatives of the Department
- c. Identifying the hindrances in enhancing the Research and Publication initiatives of the Department

While analysing the existing initiatives, the speakers highlighted the various research facilities and infrastructure such as grants offered by Center for Research such as Minor and Major Research Projects, Monographs, Working Papers and Seed Money; library resources both physical and digital resources. The speakers also analysed the research and publication credentials of the faculty members of the Department. The Speakers stressed on the importance of research and publication for academician's personal growth as well as for the enhancement of the field of the study.

Internal Observer's Observations:

Observers gave their input by laying emphasis on reading voraciously and writing incessantly on the topic of interest which shall lead to the improvement in the quality of the research. The observers also threw light on the concept of research methods.

Outcome:

The discussion was ended by inviting suggestions from the faculty members on enhancing the research and publication initiatives. The following suggestions were given by the senior faculty members:

- a. Practice writing
- b. Research before selection of topics
- c. Managing of time

d. Using credible citations in final research papers

The Last session centred on the topic "*General Aspects of Writing a Research Paper*" which was briefed in the third session of Quality Improvement Programme from 3:45-5:15 p.m. by Dr. Sonika Bharadwaj & Dr. Aradhana.

Objective of the discussion:

- To understand the basic rules for writing an effective research paper.
- To retain the checklist in mind before submitting a research paper.

Brief of the session

1. The first speaker discussed about the eight rules and also substantiated the same by giving examples. She also instructed the possible approaches to select a topic for research paper and stressed on the need to have a proper structure for a research paper.
2. The second speaker discussed about the two check list that should be kept in mind. Aspects of self-introspection and importance of the same were highlighted for a complete research paper. The fact that citations play a major role was also highlighted. Is my research paper clear and concise?
3. The video was screened at last which highlights the different idea of a writing a paper. The purpose of the paper should convey a clear idea and then on should start writing a paper and simultaneously research.

Internal Observer's observation

The session was chaired by *Dr Achyuta Nanda Mishra* who focussed upon the review of the literature to be studied upon and emphasized upon on reading more and more material upon the given subject.

On 3rd December 2016, the first session was on '*Report on Development of Project proposal*' handled by Dr. Jayadevan S. Nair & Dr. E. Vijaya Kumar and Dr. Somu C.S was the external observer.

- The session began with a presentation on Development of Project proposal by Dr Jayadevan S. Nair Sir. Sir gave an Insightful presentation on the writing of a project proposal and emphasised on the importance of having a clear and concise idea of the research problem before beginning of the research project. The session then continued with Dr E Vijaya Kumar Sir's presentation on the same.

Main Objectives of the session are:

1. To identify the points to be observed to satisfy external funders while developing a project proposal.
2. Strategies to be used to before writing a proposal.
3. To identify Issues to be considered at the beginning of project planning.
4. To promote better writing of project proposal.

Brief of the Discussion

- The session established that a project proposal is a detailed description of a series of activities aimed at solving a certain problem. The proposal should contain a detailed explanation of the justification of the project activities and implementation timeline, also Methodology. The project proposal should be a detailed and directed manifestation of the project design. The session also highlighted the steps to be taken Before Writing a Proposal and emphasised on reviewing of data available on the particular area chosen by the researcher and consultation with the experts regarding the research problem. Some vital points to be considered Before the project proposal are Refining and polishing our idea, Putting the idea into a project format, Evaluating administrative issues, Identifying potential sponsors, Ascertaining sponsor interest and, Preparing a full proposal. It was also stated that a concise, specific and targeted statement of the proposal idea is essential to the successful development of the grant application or contract response. This three- to five- sentence statement can take the form of a hypothesis, problem statement or research question, and should include evidence of the idea's importance and criteria for assessing the solution. It was recommended that proposal writers develop the project idea statement prior to starting to write the proposal, and then revisit the statement periodically to determine if the research design is developing coherently or the statement needs to be adjusted.

Internal observation:

One predominant observation was with respect to the importance of clarity in objectives, that are sought to be achieved by the researcher i.e. proposal should clearly reflect the mind of the researcher. Vague objectives lead to equally vague results. Clear strategic thinking should be reflected in the project proposal.

Other observations emphasised on the importance of:

Dedicated reading, Identifying statement of problem, Discussion with likeminded people, acquiring the ability to successfully resolving the problem so identified.

Outcome of session:

The outcome of the session was to realise the importance of undertaking projects and getting hands on experience in drafting project proposals i.e. individually undertaking Minor research projects at the university level to put theoretical knowledge into practice.

The second session was on topic- Opportunities & avenues for external funding for subject specific projects handled by Dr. Achyutananda Mishra, Dr. Fincy P and Dr. Sandeep Desai was the external observer.

The main objective of introducing this topic in the QIP, was to give an idea as to why external funded projects have been undertaken in the colleges, the various

factors affecting the selection of subjects for these projects. And also addressed the aspect, in what way these projects help in the growth of an institution at the academic level.

The major purposes of these external funded projects are, as stated by one of the presenter, it is subject specific, and also it addresses various social and governmental issues. In fact it promotes independent research in new avenues. Presenters also spoke about the various agencies engaged in funding such projects, specifically UGC, ICSSR and some NGO's. The primary purpose of external research funding was also mentioned in the course of presentation. Also had discussion as to, what would be the area of research which can be expected by the academician for doing the external funded projects. Discussed the various abilities or talents one should possess as he takes up such projects. Also had discussion as to whether the funds are getting on time, and the merits and demerits of such projects, models of externally funded projects.

The idea conveyed was that, these projects are really meant to give some solutions to the issues at hand. So such projects really help an institution to develop the teacher learning component. Presentation was concluded by stating that, the topic to be selected in such way that it should definitely serve some utility to the public.

The PhD and MRP Researchers were benefited by external observers presence and suggestions. The observer highlighted the point as to utility of the topic purpose of research manage of information the after effect of taking general topic ,importance of taking care of technicalities and blue book citations .The faculties were able to highlight the area of research and what further scope is available in research.

The main objective of the QIP was to promote value that facilitates academic and professional development of teachers through interaction with external observers in their effort to complete research.
